● **OHSAS 18001**

OHSAS 18001 makes the occupational health and safety process the core element of workplace activities and facilities. In doing so, it covers the risks generated by several companies working on the same site, with the focus on continuous improvement. Structured in accordance with standard ISO 14001, these guidelines are fully compatible with ISO 9001.

● **ILO-OSH 2001**

A management tool backed up by the International Labour Office (ILO), ILO-OSH 2001 is a globally recognised guideline adopted by all the actors involved (governments, employee and employer representatives). These guidelines focus on core values such as employee participation and consultation with their representatives.
